Points from Sunday's Message

- 1. The Christian's belief is trust in God and not merely assertions about God.
- 2. Christians believe in God as He has revealed Himself in Scripture.
- 3. God has revealed Himself to us as the Father of mercies who is abundant in compassion and kindness.
- 4. God in the Bible is the highest and greatest, reigning over and above all.
- 5. The Almighty Father of the Bible is the maker, sustainer, and purpose-giver of all things.

Key Verse:

""One God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all."

- Ephesians 4:6

Discussion Questions:

- 1. What does it mean to you personally that God is called "Father" in Scripture?
 - How has your understanding of God as Father changed over time?
- 2. The Nicene Creed begins with "We believe in one God, the Father Almighty..."
 - Why is it significant that God is described as both Father and Almighty?
 - How do these two characteristics shape our trust in Him?
- 3. In what ways do earthly fathers help or hinder people from understanding the nature of God as Father?
 - How can we gently help others who struggle with the idea of God as Father?

- 4. How does acknowledging God as Creator of heaven and earth affect how you live day-to-day?
 - Are there areas in your life where you're not living like He is both Father and Creator?
- 5. How does knowing God as your Father impact the way you pray, worship, or approach Scripture?
 - Do you approach Him more like a loving Dad or a distant ruler—and why?
- 6. What are some attributes of God the Father that bring you the most comfort or confidence in your faith?
 - How can we better reflect those attributes to the people around us?
